Who Can Understand His Errors?
Psalm 19:12

Psalm 19 declares the perfect revelation of the Lord. David described God’s revelation of Himself in nature (“The heavens declare the glory of God...” verse 1) and the perfection of God’s revealed law (“The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul” verse 7). He ended the psalm with the prayer, “Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my strength and my Redeemer.”

While David praised God’s revelation, he prayed for deliverance from one of the human race’s most common problems – trying to make God’s Law fit my life instead of making my life fit God’s Law. David wrote, “Who can understand *his* errors? Cleanse me from secret *faults*” (Psalm 19:12). The errors and secret faults David described were not God’s. He has none. David, instead, recognized the human tendency toward self-justification.

Do I adjust my practices to fit God’s scriptural principles? Or do I find exemptions and justifications that excuse my behavior?

“I don’t normally use those words, but I was provoked.”

“I always try to follow the Golden Rule, but ‘business is business.’”

“I probably shouldn’t be doing/watching/listening to this, but everyone else is.”

There will always be conflict within me as I look into the mirror of God’s word (James 1:25) and I see the true state of my life contrasted with scripture. I pray, with David, that I will change myself (with God’s help and forgiveness) rather than trying to change my interpretation of God’s Word.
