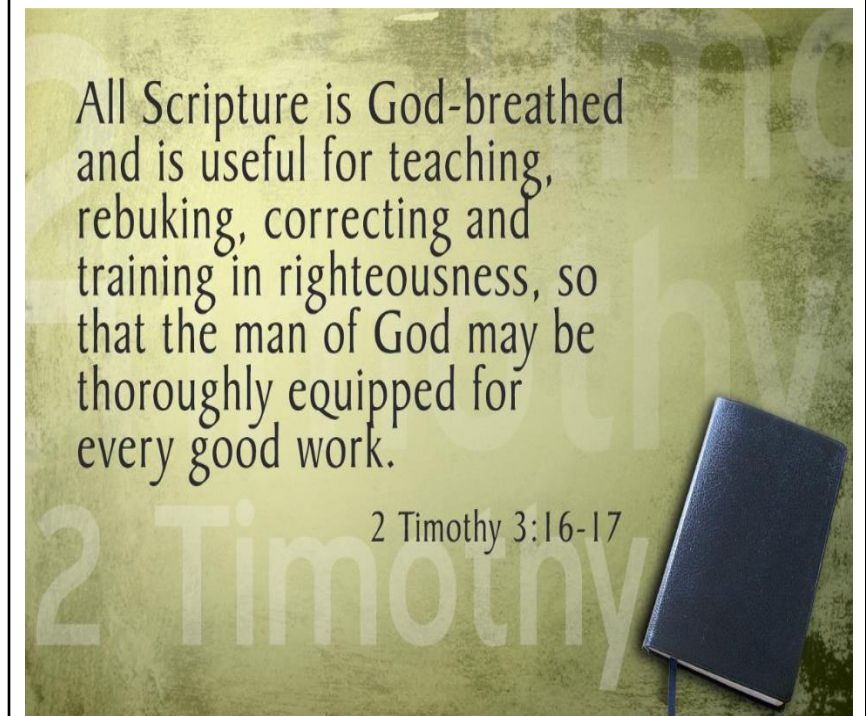

**Elder of the month: James Herring**



In Defense of the Occasional New Song

*"Sing to the Lord a new song, And His praise in the assembly of saints." – Psalm 149:1*

I consulted a concordance to find the new song the saints will sing in heaven in Revelation. I found the two references (5:9 and 14:3), but I was struck by how many times the Bible encouraged God's people to praise Him with a "new song." Six times in the Psalms (33:3; 40:3; 96:1; 98:1; 144:9 and 149:1), and once in Isaiah (42:10), God's word exhorts His people to praise him with a "new song." While these Old Covenant passages sometimes mention other forms of worship not authorized in New Testament worship (like dancing and instrumental music), yet we are still commanded to sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16). Are we missing something if we never learn a new one?

That is counterintuitive as far as I'm concerned. I love singing and I love learning a new song. I just don't like to do it in a Sunday morning assembly. I hate the surprise when I'm just sure the church knows a song and I end up almost singing a solo instead of leading the church in worship. My thinking has been, "How can anyone worship when they're learning a song for the first time?"

However, if God encourages us through His inspired Psalmist and prophet to "sing a new song," there must be some value in doing so. We must speak "one to another" in our singing, so, most of the time, I assume we know the melody that we make with our hearts. Think back to the first time you sang some new song, though. Perhaps you were visiting a church that knew it well. Maybe, only the song leader knew it. Either way, that first hearing made an impression. I loved the message of "As the Deer" the first time I sang it. Every old standard was once a new song. New lyrics make us think new thoughts.

I still don't want to sing all new songs any Sunday. I'm not sure it would enhance worship to have a new song introduced more than once or twice a month. It would probably be wise, when a new song is introduced, that a good number of the members have already learned the song, perhaps at another time. Yet, there is nothing quite like discovering a new song that expresses the worship that is already in my heart.
