Marie Clark may have had a mild stroke. She had an MRI done today.



Chronological or Not?

In 2 Kings 8, the king of Israel summoned Elisha's servant Gehazi. He wanted to hear him tell the miracles Elisha had performed. Gehazi told about the resurrection of the Shunammite woman's son. As he finished the story, the woman came before the king to appeal for the return of her property. Gehazi was able to say, "This is the woman, and this is her son." (2 Kings 8:5). The king commanded that her property be restored along with all the proceeds of the field.

Most commentators suggest that the account occurs out of order. Gehazi is not generally known for his involvement with the Shunammite woman. Instead, he is better known for a terrible mistake. He got greedy. Elisha, his master, refused to accept anything from Naaman after he was cleansed from his leprosy. Gehazi lied to Naaman and to Elisha and accepted two talents of silver and two changes of clothing. He was punished with Naaman's leprosy for the rest of his life (2 Kings 5:27).

I don't know if the account is out of order or not. Commentators assume that the king would not have allowed a leper in his court. The scriptures don't say that, though. I would like to believe that Gehazi found a way to be useful once again.

I don't know about Gehazi, but I know about me. Praise God for His grace and forgiveness. I may sometimes suffer the consequences that follow from my sins, but God has been true to His promise: "...their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more." (Hebrews 8:12)
