Windows in Heaven

Typically, windows are thought to allow light and air into dark and stuffy indoor spaces. One metaphor about windows in heaven is used three times in scripture to describe unimaginable abundance.

When the flood came on the earth, Genesis 7:11 described the never-before and never-after seen abundance of water as the "fountains of the deep" bursting forth, and the "windows of heaven" being opened. Though there was no glass to be opened between the firmament and the ground, God brought enough rain and groundwater to flood the earth, that it was as though heaven's windows had been opened, and all the water in the sky was released.

In 2 Kings 7, Samaria was besieged by the Syrian army. Starvation was so common that two mothers had even resorted to cannibalism. Ahab tore his clothes and sent an assassin to murder Elisha. Elisha's response was to predict that, the next day, flour and barley would be sold in huge quantities for bargain prices at the city gates. The king's attendant sarcastically replied, "Look, if the Lord would make windows in heaven, could this thing be?" Elisha predicted that the officer would see the blessing but would not eat of it. In fact, he was trampled to death by the mob who took advantage of God's blessing. (2 Kings 7:18-20).

The third reference is most important. Malachi recorded God's challenge to Israel and to us...

Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and try Me now in this," Says the Lord of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it." (Malachi 3:10)

The blessings of God come to those who give generously. As the old preacher said, "God has a bigger shovel than I do." The one thing in which we are expected to put God to the test is to try to out-give Him. There are windows in heaven. They open for those who open their wallets and purses to God.
