What About John?

In John 21:18-22 Jesus and Peter carried on an interesting conversation. Jesus described Peter's eventual death as an aged martyr. Peter pointed out John and asked, "What about this man?" Jesus replied, "...What is that to you?"

"What about John?" remains a common question. Rather than accept personal responsibility, human nature seeks an excuse. We compare ourselves among ourselves, looking for someone who does less or does it poorly so that when the call to service comes, we may say, "But what about John?"

The Bible taught the importance of personal responsibility. Romans 14:12 said, "Every one of us shall give an account of himself to God." In 2 Corinthians 5:10 Paul again wrote, "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ that everyone may receive the things done in his body according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad." When the command to be baptized into Christ was first given in Acts 2:38, that command was addressed to "every one of you."

As much as I might like to know everything about everybody, not everything is my business. Don't worry about John. He can't go to heaven for you. Make sure you are right before God yourself.

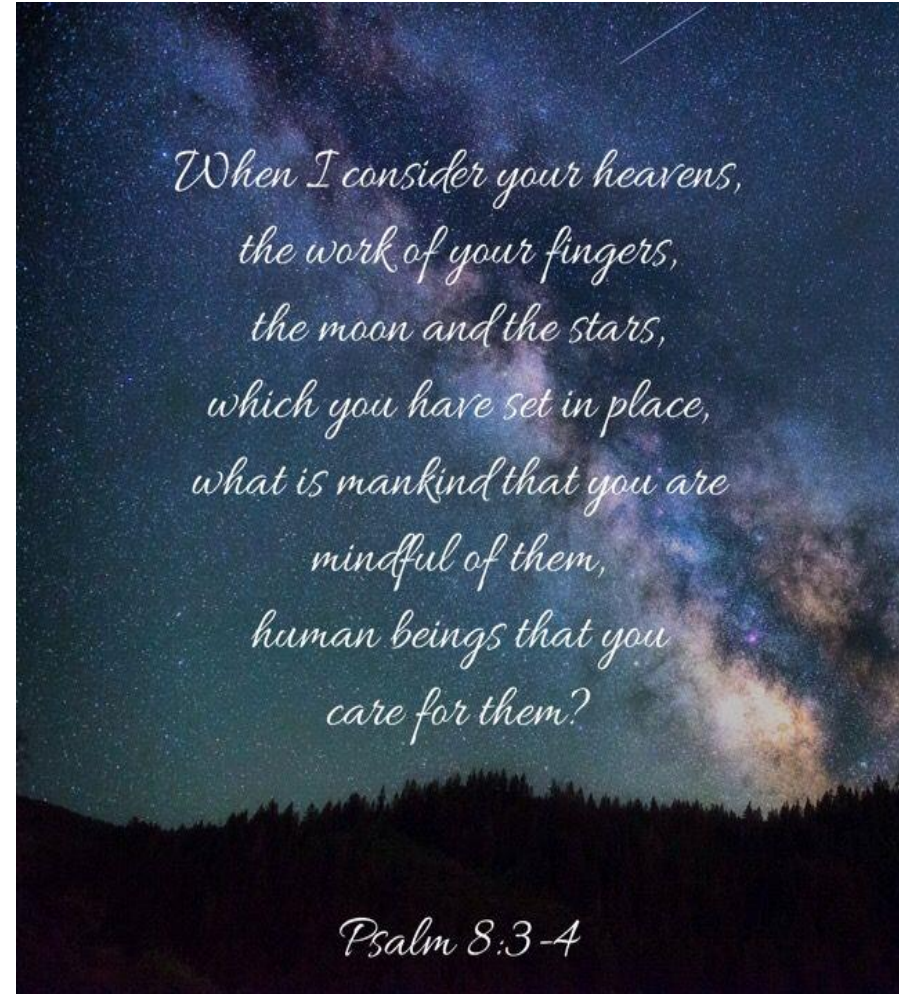

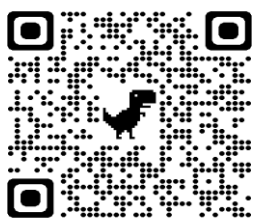

John Johnson has been moved to Harvest of Aledo memory care. If you would like to send cards, please continue mailing them to Debra Griggs' home address.

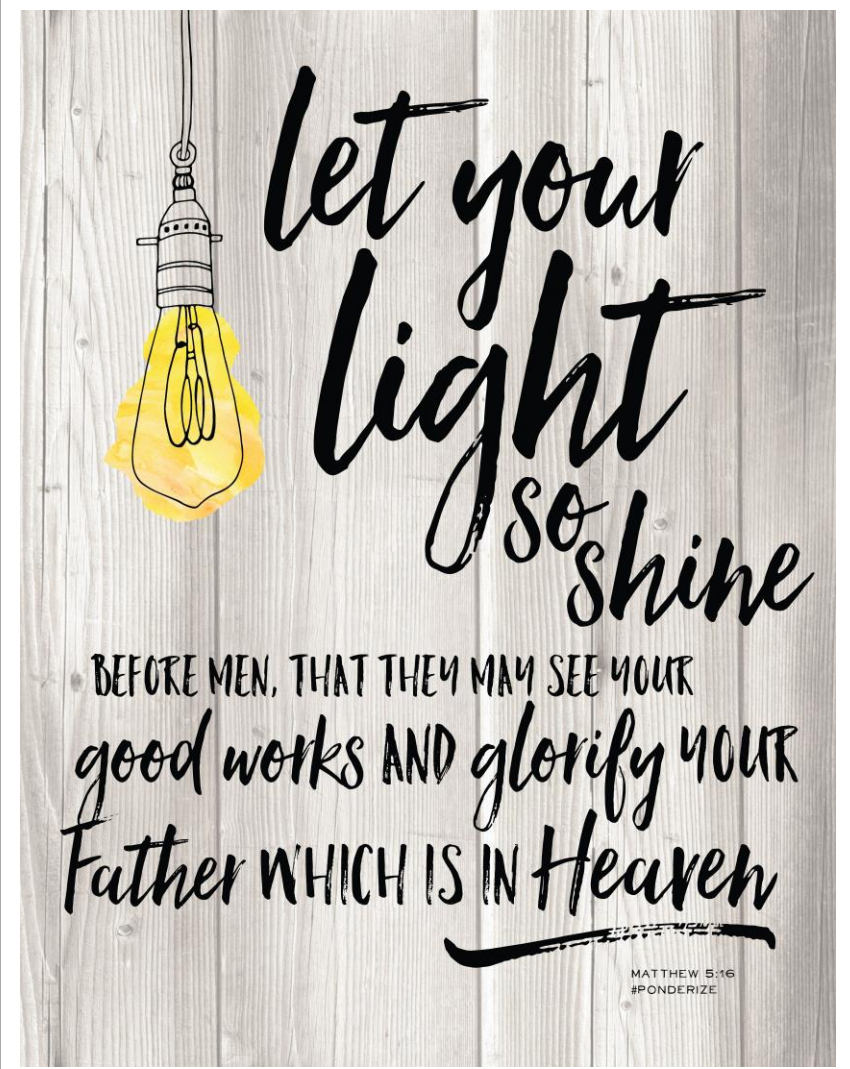
Joyce Moore had heart catheterization and a stent put in on March 22, and will be having surgery on her eyes in the near future.
