
Please keep **Randy McClendon's** dad in your prayers. He has been put on Hospice for the last stages of dementia.

Does That Really Fit?

Ever worked on a jigsaw puzzle with a "crammer?" A "crammer" is a person who helps pieces fit together that don't really fit together. It's hard to convince them that a proper fit should not require a mallet.

On the other hand, some puzzle pieces fit together perfectly, but they don't seem to have anything to do with one another until one can see the big picture. Maybe they're very different colors. If they belong together, they will help reveal the picture eventually.

Matthew seven, verses one through five are very familiar. There, Jesus famously taught, "Judge not, that you be not judged..." He used the absurd metaphor of the speck in the eye and the log in the eye. Verse six is like one of those puzzle pieces that doesn't seem to fit. Jesus taught, "Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine." In one breath Jesus says, "Do not judge" and then he says to make a judgement about who is a dog or a pig.

Look at the bigger picture. There is no contradiction at all. Judgment can take two forms that are both wrong. A hypocrite's judgment is rejected out of hand because it is absurd. The sincere individual who just wants to help a soul in error must take care as well, though. Jesus warns even the one without an "eye-beam" that the first judgment to make is whether or not it is wise to share good advice. Judgment from the hypocrite is inappropriate and so is judgment offered to the ingrate. The message from Christ is keep harsh judgments to yourself. Be a fruit inspector (Matthew 7:15-20) rather than a critic.
