World Changing Events

Some think learning History is a list of names, dates, and events. It isn't. Most names, dates and events are known only to a few people. I doubt the world will ever celebrate January 25, 1960, even though I think my birthday is pretty important.

Almost all Americans know July 4, 1776. The Declaration of Independence changed the world. No American who was old enough to understand what was happening has forgotten September 11, 2001. The attacks on the Pentagon, the World Trade Center and United Flight 93 will not be forgotten. December 7, 1941 was immediately recognized by FDR as a "date which will live in infamy." These dates and many others must be remembered by students of history, not because they are tortured by cruel professors, but, because these were events that changed the world.

No date in human history compares, however, with the first day of the week following Passover, AD 33. The resurrection of Christ changed the central question of life from, "Will I live again?" (Job 14:14) to "Where will I live again?" That day the grave of Christ Jesus was empty. Because of that day, one day, every grave ever dug will be empty (John 5:28-29).

The death, burial and resurrection of Christ are so important they are celebrated every first day of the week. That is why the church met (Acts 20:7). They are so important they are reenacted by every obedient believer who is buried with Christ in baptism and "raised" to "walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:3-5). I'm glad that the world is recognizing the empty tomb today on this holiday we call Easter. This morning's lesson will emphasize the world-changing importance of the resurrection of Christ. It ought to be celebrated. We invite everyone to continue that celebration at the Lord's Table every Lord's Day with us. If you haven't been saved yet, we would love to study God's word with you. We would love to witness your reenactment of Christ's resurrection as you rise from the waters of baptism.
