Birthplace or Grave

Abraham Lincoln is one of our most respected US Presidents. Only George Washington is honored more. His image is on the penny, the five-dollar bill, and multiple postage stamps. His memorial in Washington is perhaps the most visited and impressive in the capitol. While I was preparing this week's sermon on understanding the Bible, I remembered two monuments to Mr. Lincoln.

In Hodgenville, Kentucky the National Park Service maintains the traditional birthplace of Abraham Lincoln. Fifty-six steps, one for each year of Lincoln's short life, lead to a magnificent stone temple completely enclosing a log cabin. While Lincoln was, in fact, born near that log cabin, he was not born in that actual structure. All traces of the original cabin were gone before anyone thought to try to preserve the site. Some thought that a few of the original logs were reused by a neighbor for another house, so those logs were used to build another cabin. I suppose I wasn't a very good tourist when I visited the park several years ago. I waited until no other visitors were present before I asked the guide my questions. She admitted the cabin was the "traditional," not the "actual" birthplace of Abraham Lincoln.

In Springfield, Illinois, however, the state of Illinois maintains the Lincoln Tomb. The structure is a magnificent building of marble and bronze where Abraham Lincoln, his sons Edward, William, and Thomas ("Tad"), and his wife, Mary, are all buried. This memorial is not just "traditional," it is the "actual" grave of our martyred president.

Most Christians seem to agree that the Bible is important. There is too much disagreement about what that means. To some, the Bible contains the word of God, but they don't accept what it says about itself. The Bible claims verbal, plenary inspiration. Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 3:16-17,

¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that the servant of God^[a] may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. (NASB)

The Bible isn't just a traditional book that might have God's word within it somewhere; every word of all of it is inspired by God. It doesn't just *contain* God's word. It *is* God's word. There is as much difference between the two concepts as between a traditional Lincoln site and an actual one. The Bible is the real deal.
