

Deadline

It's Thursday morning as I write this and, once again, I'm up against my deadline. Don't worry. Neither the church secretary nor the shepherds will kill me if I don't submit this article before 10 a.m.

The term was originally two words, and dates to the early eighteen-sixties. It referred to a line drawn inside or outside a prison. If a prisoner crossed that line, he would be shot without warning.

Most deadlines are exaggerations of that idea. Late college applicants aren't shot, and neither are summer campers who are tardy with their applications. Even the IRS doesn't shoot late filers, but the penalties and interest may make it feel that way.

Deadlines are useful if they spur one on to take important actions. Not all of them are visible, either. A literal deadline passes when treatable cancers go undetected too long. There may be a deadline for weight loss. Many have passed their deadlines for stopping destructive habits.

Terminal patients have deadlines, but so do we all. Hebrews 9:27 makes it clear that everyone has a deadline. "It is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment." That is a line that is quickly approaching. Am I ready for it? By the grace of God, I can know that I am (1 John 5:13).

The article is done, though. I'm ready for this deadline. It's 8:55.
