Gasoline for 44.9 Cents Last Week.

Henry DeHart of Chattanooga, Tennessee, couldn't believe his receipt when he charged 12.557 gallons of premium gasoline at the "Mr. Zip" convenience store. His receipt showed his credit card had only been charged \$5.64. That was only 44.9 cents per gallon! \$4.64 was the average price per gallon for premium that day.

Most people would have driven away with a full tank and a big smile, but Mr. DeHart didn't. He went to the owner and tried to explain that there was a problem with his gas pump. There was a considerable language barrier, and the owner wasn't understanding the problem. Henry said, "print my receipt." When the owner saw that he had just charged only \$5.64 for 12 gallons of gas, he ran back around the counter and began correcting the error.

Henry not only informed the owner of the error but paid what he should have been charged for the gas. Sadly, not everyone was so honest. The error had gone unnoticed for half a day. The next customer was decidedly unhappy about it.

I wonder how many people just pumped the "cheap" gas and drove away with a smile? (Even though the gas wasn't cheap for the "Mr. Zip" store.) Were any of them Christians? If so, perhaps Romans 2:24 might apply. There Paul wrote, "The name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you." I don't know if Mr. DeHart is a Christian or not, but, if he is, he certainly let his light shine (Matthew 5:16).

Thank God for Henry DeHart! May his tribe increase!
