Procrastinator's Weekly – Published Quarterly

Did you hear about the new magazine? "Procrastinator's Weekly - published quarterly, or semi-annually, or whenever we get around to it."

Procrastination is the act of unnecessarily postponing decisions or actions. Statistics suggest that it chronically affects 15-20% of adults, and that about 25% of adults think that procrastination is a defining personality trait for them. College students could be some of the worst. 80-95% of them admit to engaging in procrastinations to some degree while 70% consider themselves to be procrastinators. About 50% say that they procrastinate in a consistent and problematic manner. It is likely that they aren't the worst. They are probably more prone to be subjects of an academic survey (Source - solvingprocrastination.com).

In 1967, the Irish Rovers sang a cute Shel Silverstein song called "The Unicorn." According to the song, the unicorns missed their place on the ark because they were...

hiding, playing silly games.

Kicking and splashing while the rain was pourin'.

Oh, them silly unicorns.

Noah spent the 120 years it took him to build the ark preaching righteousness (Genesis 6:3, 8; 2 Peter 2:5). He, his wife, his three sons and their wives all were saved on the ark. I don't think the song is accurate suggesting that the unicorns became extinct through procrastination. Humans, though, might just have been thinking about obeying Noah's call to righteousness, but never quite got around to it. Once God closed the door, and it started raining, it was too late.

Likely, every preacher who has preached for very long can tell the story of a soul that put off obeying the gospel until it was too late. I remember hearing one friend tell the story of a farmer he had tried to reach. He was critically injured and begged to be taken to be baptized while being rushed to the hospital. I remember thinking at the time, "I hope I never have a story like that to tell." I hadn't been preaching three years before I had one, too.

I don't need another one. I don't want another one. If you are putting off being baptized, being faithful or being more faithful, don't. Obey today.
