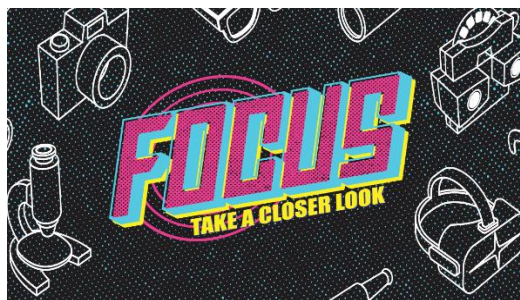

Luke 10:25-37

### Not the Best Decision

Did you see the same article I did this week? It was a reprint, but still rather catchy.

**“Man arrested after calling police to have his drugs tested.”**

That was Amanda Jackson's headline on a CNN news release. According to the article, on June 12, 2018, Douglas Kelly of Hawthorne, Florida called the Putnam County Sheriff's Office asking them to test the drugs he had bought so that he could press charges against the seller. He complained of a bad reaction after smoking what he had been told was meth, but he didn't think it was meth after all.

Police offered to test the narcotic he'd purchased if he would bring it in to the station. Sure enough, he did. It was. They arrested Douglas. Reportedly, the Putnam Country Sheriff's Office posted on Facebook, “

*If you believe you were sold bad drugs, we are offering a free service to test them for you. Remember, our detectives are always ready to assist anyone who believes they were misled in their illegal drug purchase.”*

I wish I could laugh at this article, but it's just too sad. Allow me an observation or two:

1. Sin isn't smart. Its final wages are death (Romans 6:23; James 1:15) and before that it yields shame.

2. Demanding justice is a dangerous thing. Far too many mote advisers are beam sufferers (Matthew 7:3-5).

3. Anger may lower one's IQ. Balaam may have been quite wise at times, but, when angry, he lost an argument with a donkey (Numbers 22:30).

4. It is better to be thought a fool and be silent than to speak and remove all doubt (Abraham Lincoln). Honest Abe was right but wasn't the first to share that wisdom. Soloman said, “Even a fool is counted wise when he holds his peace; When he shuts his lips, he is considered perceptive.” (Proverbs 17:28).

5. It would have been better to suffer the wrong (1 Corinthians 6:7).
