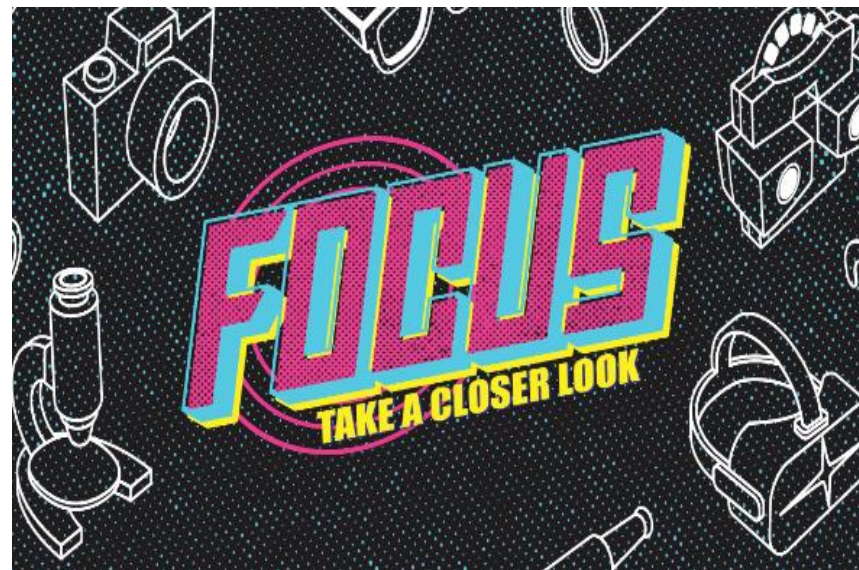
Ladies' Bible Class

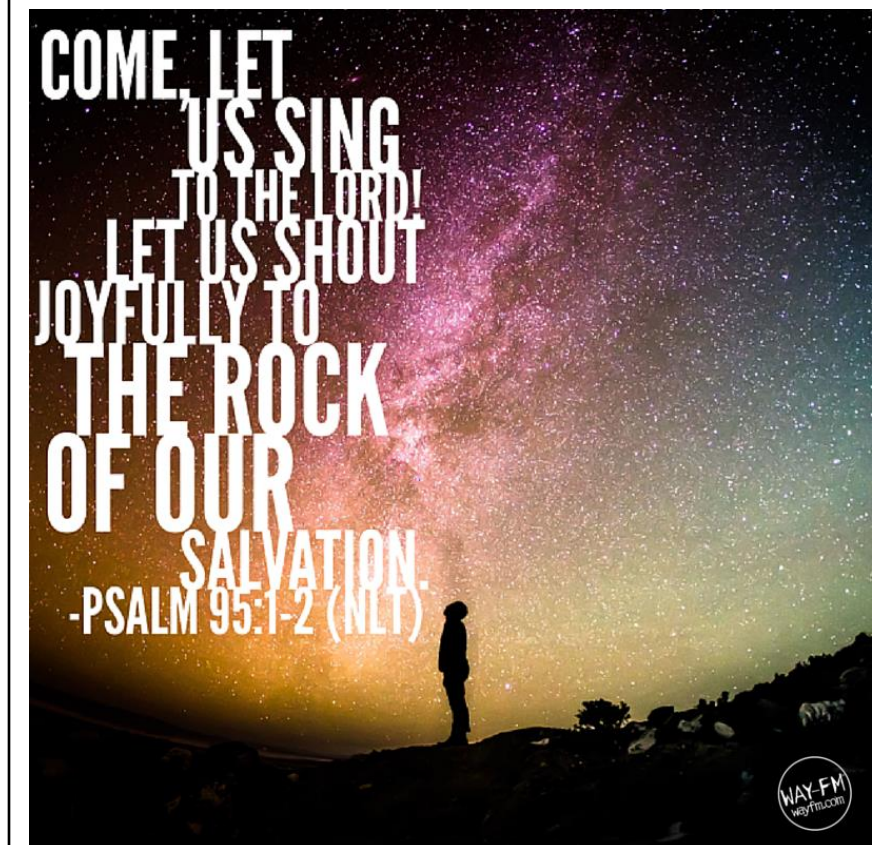
Scotty Kasterke, Dwain Kasterke's cousin has bone cancer and is on Hospice. Please keep him in your prayers.
