What Can Women Do?

Discussions and gender roles in the church tend to center around what men and women should do in public assemblies (Note 1 Timothy 2:11-12 and 1 Corinthians 14:33-35). Unfortunately, the impression is often left that men can do anything, and women can do nothing. Nothing could be further than the truth.

Women provide an invaluable perspective. Men are foolish to ignore the wisdom that women provide. Men and women complement one another in the way they see every situation. Males who don't listen to the opinions and advice of female Christians lose perspective.

Wise church leaders encourage women to lead their own ministries. Women's classes are often taught and organized by men. Why? Faithful, older women have the scriptural obligation to teach the younger women (Titus 2:4-5). Vacation Bible Schools, Sunday Schools, benevolent works and a host of church ministries are done primarily, if not almost exclusively, by women. Why is male leadership required when women can carry out a particular work of the Lord themselves?

Women need to have frequent opportunities to worship without men being present. 1 Corinthians makes no sense unless women had regular opportunities to lead their own worship. Chapter 11 dealt with culturally appropriate dress when women prayed and prophesied (5) while chapter 14 forbids women from prophesying in the general assembly (33-34). Like Phillip's four unmarried daughters who prophesied (Acts 21:9), they must have had the opportunity to do so. Women's Days are far too infrequent. Talented female speakers and musicians ought to have their opportunity to lead one another in praise to God.

Women win souls. Both Priscilla and Aquila took Apollos aside and taught him the way of the Lord more perfectly (Acts 18:26). Jesus sent the woman at the well into town and she brought her community to Him. Hannah did not hesitate to correct Eli when he accused her of being drunk, nor should she have. Eunice and Lois were Timothy's first and most important teachers.

Women are vital in God's church.
