Misplaced Blame

A toddler was about to crash into the protruding corner of a desk in the church office this week and a brother cushioned the blow by putting his hand over that sharp edge. He couldn't stop the careening child, so the boy bumped his head on a knuckle. The little one began to cry, and gave his protector a stare that almost said out loud, "How dare you do that to me?" The toddler seemed to believe that his elder had hit him on the head! He wouldn't have anything more to do with him.

That was a case of misplaced blame. That poor brother had nothing but that toddler's best interests at heart, but he still got the blame.

God gets a lot of misplaced blame. Job's wife encouraged him to blame God. When he had lost all of his wealth, his children, and his health, she told him, "...curse God, and die." (Job 2:9) God did not deserve to be cursed. Job and Mrs. Job were both unaware that Satan had caused every one of their losses (Job 1:12; 2:7). Job's response to the loss of his wealth and his children was, "...the Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21) He told his wife, "Shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?" (Job 2:10) God actually limited the harm Satan could cause (Job 1:12, 2:6).

The fact is, God does not cause the evil that happens in this world. He does not tempt anyone with evil (James 1:13). Satan deserves the blame for the evil he inspires others to commit. I am tempted when I am drawn away by my own lust (James 1:14). God's part is to watch over me, limiting the evil to what I can bear, and making a way to escape (1 Cor. 10:13).

I won't always understand. Job didn't. Nevertheless, I hope I will always say with him, "Blessed be the name of the Lord."
