A Few Practical Ideas About Protecting the Assembly? (Part IV)

In addition to practicing prevention, good passive security, and being intentional about defending the flock physically, may I suggest the following...

Have an initial training course. Form a security team and get them the best initial training possible. I am not a sworn peace officer, but I know a few. So do you. Perhaps you have an experienced member of your congregation who is a current, former, or retired trained law enforcement agent. If not, a nearby congregation or your local police or sheriff's department will have those who would likely volunteer to provide invaluable training. Christians carrying concealed weapons are not a security team. Without training they can be more of a liability than an asset.

Have ongoing training. Good training is necessary, but it is not a one-and-done activity. Good security means that team members immediately recognize common threats and are able to act and react almost automatically. That requires regular continuing training. Security team members must requalify, not just to prove they can shoot and hit what they aim at, but to be absolutely sure under what circumstances deadly force is legally justified. Members of our team most recently completed the course "Church Security Use of Force Firearms Simulator Training" through Ozark Shoot - Don't Shoot Solutions.

Practice persistence. Security is only as effective as the willingness to use it. There is a comfort level in security, but that level is usually not very secure at all. Good security demands that entry and exit points to the building be limited and monitored. Magnetic locks secure all of our doors and electronic key cards are limited. It is tempting to prop open doors or open a door and let a stranger into the building. We must not grow "weary in well doing" (Galatians 6:9). The best security in the world is no security at all if it is not used.
