"Three Kicks in Every Dollar"

William Allen White was a wealthy journalist. In 1924 he donated fifty acres of land to the city of Emporia, Kansas. The land was to be used to create "Peter Pan Park" in memory of his daughter Mary who was killed in a horseback riding accident at sixteen. When he gave the deed of the property to the mayor, he said,

"This is the last kick in a fistful of dollars I am getting rid of today. I have always tried to teach you that there are three kicks in every dollar—one when you make it... the second kick is when you have it... the third kick comes when you give it away... The big kick is the last one" (*Emporia Gazette*).

The only real joy money can provide is found in giving.

The Israelites gave so much to erect the tabernacle that they had to be restrained from giving (Exodus 36:6).

The Macedonians gave beyond their ability, and begged Paul to accept their gift for the needy Christians in Jerusalem, because they first gave themselves to Christ (2 Corinthians 8:3-5).

A Christian works, not only to support oneself, but to give to others in need (Ephesians 4:32).

Paul reminded the elders of the Ephesian church that he had worked with his own hands to provide for himself and those with him. He reminded them of Jesus' statement, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:34).

The love of money is the root of all kinds of evil (1 Timothy 6:10) but giving can bring rejoicing (Philippians 4:10).

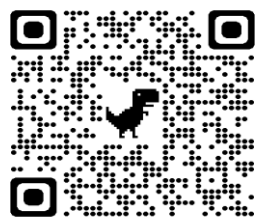
