Am I a Horn-Honker or a Car-Starter?

A motorist once stalled at a stoplight and couldn't get the car started. A line formed behind the vehicle, and one impatient driver began honking. The stalled driver became so frustrated that he got out of the car, marched back to the impatient person and said, "I can't get my car started. Why don't you go and try to start it for me? I'll be glad to honk your horn for you while you're gone."

There will never be a shortage of "horn-honkers" in this world. We fill social media with our complaints. We fill school board meetings with angry vitriol (though, sometimes, justifiably so). We gossip with one another in church vestibules about what "they" are doing.

It is so much easier to complain than to try to help get the car started. When Saul of Tarsus first returned to Jerusalem after his conversion, everyone was afraid of him, and they did not believe that he was a disciple (Acts 9:26). According to Galatians 1:18, it had been three years since Saul's conversion before he went up from Antioch and Arabia to Jerusalem. There were plenty of horn-honkers. Only Barnabas seemed to take Saul seriously. He took the risk and listened. He risked his own reputation and the apostles' lives by bringing Saul to them (Acts 9:27).

Am I a horn-honker or a car starter? We all know the church needs to grow. Am I just honking my horn about it or am I inviting my family, friends, and neighbors to worship with us? Am I welcoming every visitor before I engage my friends in conversation at worship? After all, who is more important? Am I praying for the elders and staff every day? Let's do all we can to help get the car started!
